City Hosts Final "Bike Miami Days"

Downtown Miami turned into a two wheeler's paradise Sunday as the city hosted its last Bike Miami Days.

Beginning at 9 a.m. the streets were closed to traffic so that those taking part could explore the heart of Miami on foot, by bicycle, on a skateboard or any other form of self-propelled transportation they desired. In addition to bike clinics, the event featured a number of bands, yoga and stretching classes, bounce houses, face painting, jugglers, balloon artists and dance contests at the downtown courthouse, along Flagler Street and at Mary Brickell Village.

In addition to the arts and crafts at Mary Brickell Village, **CBS4's Michelle Gillen** helmed the Adopt-A-Bear cart; all teddy bears sold are donated to agencies which hand them out to neglected and abused children throughout the county.

The street festival runs until 2 p.m.

Bike Miami Days were created by City of Miami Mayor Manny Diaz in November 2008 to reconnect people with their community by giving them the opportunity to explore our City in a new way.
